This angel food cake is easy and it only requires 2 ingredients! You can cover and store leftovers in the refrigerator. After it's baked, the topping possibilities are practically endless, fresh fruits, cool whip...


Prep: 10 mins / Cook: 40 mins / Additional: 2 hours for cooling / Servings: 12

Ingredients:

- 1 (16 ounce) package angel food cake mix
- 1 (20 ounce) can crushed pineapple, in juice

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Combine dry cake mix with crushed pineapple and juice in a large bowl. Beat on low speed for 30 seconds, then beat on medium speed for 1 minute. Pour into an ungreased 11x14 glass cake pan or 10-inch tube pan.



4. For tube pan, run a knife around the edges and turn cooled cake out onto a serving place. Use a serrated knife to cut into slices. For glass pan, you can slice and serve from the pan.

¡Este pastel de comida de ángel es fácil y solo requiere 2 ingredientes! Puede cubrir y almacenar las sobras en el refrigerador. Después de que se hornea, las posibilidades de cobertura son prácticamente infinitas, frutas frescas, látigo fresco, ...

Preparación: 10 minutos / Cocción: 40 minutos / Adicional: 2 horas para enfriar / Porciones: 12

Ingredientes:

1 (16 onzas) paquete de mezcla de pastel de comida de ángel

1 (20 onzas) lata de piña triturada, en jugo

Indicaciones:

- Precaliente el horno a 350 grados F (175 grados C).
- Combine la mezcla seca del pastel con la piña triturada y el jugo en un tazón grande. Batir a baja velocidad durante 30 segundos, luego batir a velocidad media durante 1 minuto. Vierta en una bandeja para pasteles de vidrio de 11x14 sin engrasar o en una bandeja de tubo de 10 pulgadas.
- Hornea en el horno precalentado hasta que esté dorado profundo, de 40 a 45 minutos. Retire del horno e inmediatamente gire boca abajo para enfriar, si usa una sartén de tubo, aproximadamente 2 horas. Para la bandeja para pasteles de vidrio, colóquela en la rejilla de enfriamiento.
- Para la sartén de tubo, pase un cuchillo alrededor de los bordes y gire el pastel enfriado en un lugar para servir. Use un cuchillo dentado para cortar en rodajas. Para la sartén de vidrio, puede cortar y servir de la sartén.



The day after she passed away my 4-year-old daughter Meredith was crying and talking about how much she missed Abbey. She asked if we could write a letter to God so that when Abbey got to Heaven, God would recognize her. I told her that I thought that we could, so she dictated these words:

Dear God,

Will you please take care of my dog?

Abbey died yesterday and is with you in heaven.

I miss her very much.

I'm happy that you let me have her as my dog even though she got sick.

I hope you will play with her. She likes to swim and play with balls.

I am sending a picture of her so when you see her you will know that she is my dog.

I really miss her.

We put the letter in an envelope with a picture of Abbey & Meredith and addressed it to God/Heaven.

We put our return address on it. Meredith pasted several stamps on the front of the envelope because she said it would take lots of stamps to get the letter all the way to heaven.

That afternoon she dropped it into the letter box at the post office.

A few days later, she asked if God had gotten the letter yet. I told her that I thought He had.

Yesterday, there was a package wrapped in gold paper on our front porch addressed, 'To Meredith' in an unfamiliar hand. Meredith opened it.

Inside was a book by Mr. Rogers called, 'When a Pet Dies.'

Taped to the inside front cover was the letter we had written to God in its opened envelope.

On the opposite page was the picture of Abbey & Meredith and this note:

Dear Meredith,

Abbey arrived safely in heaven.

Having the picture was a big help and I recognized her right away.

Abbey isn't sick anymore. Her spirit is here with me just like it stays in your heart.

Abbey loved being your dog.

Since we don't need our bodies in heaven, I don't have any pockets to keep your picture in so I'm sending it back to you in this little book for you to keep and have something to remember Abbey by.

Thank you for the beautiful letter and thank your mother for helping you write it and sending it to me.

What a wonderful mother you have. I picked her especially for you.

I send my blessings every day and remember that I love you very much.

By the way, I'm easy to find.

I am wherever there is love.

Esa tarde lo dejó caer en el buzón de la oficina de correos.

Unos días más tarde, ella preguntó si Dios ya había recibido la carta. Le dije que creía que sí.

Ayer, había un paquete envuelto en papel dorado en nuestro porche delantero dirigido, 'A Meredith' en una mano desconocida. Meredith lo abrió.
